Dear Attorneys Kinne and Kettles,

This letter acknowledges receipt of the Defendant's Application for Sentence Review in connection with the above-captioned matter.

The Sentence Review Board requires a copy of the transcript from the sentencing hearing in order to review a case. If the imposition of this sentence was a result of a violation of probation, the Sentence Review Board will need the transcript from the original sentencing hearing, along with the transcript of the most recent sentencing. **It is the responsibility of the party requesting sentence review to contact the transcript provider to make arrangements for preparation of the sentencing transcript(s) and for payment of the cost of the transcript(s).** Attached are instructions on how to request a transcript. Once the transcript is received by the requesting party, it will then be their responsibility to distribute a copy to opposing counsel AND to the Sentence Review Division. Please email a copy to Amy Bisson, the Sentence Review Clerk, at [abisson@courts.state.nh.us](mailto:abisson@courts.state.nh.us).

Sentence review CANNOT go forward without the transcript(s). **If you do not request preparation of the transcript of sentencing within 30 days from the date of this letter, you run the risk of having the Application for Sentence Review dismissed, with prejudice, by the Sentence Review Board.** If you need assistance, please contact the Clerk of the sentencing court.

If this case is pending Supreme Court appeal and you wish to have the Application for Sentence Review placed on "hold" pending resolution of the appeal, you will have 30 days upon receipt of this letter to notify this office and make that request.

The rules of the Sentence Review Division permit the Board to review the pleadings and the transcript and summarily affirm without a hearing. If the Board determines that a hearing is necessary, the parties will be so notified. At that time, if the defendant wishes to have counsel appointed for sentence review, he/she must file a financial affidavit with the sentencing court and request that counsel be appointed for the purpose of sentence review only.

If a hearing is requested, a hearing will be scheduled and a formal Notice of Hearing will be forthcoming. If the Board summarily affirms the sentence(s) without a hearing, the parties will be notified of the decision immediately.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPLY FOR SENTENCE REVIEW**

Dustin Duren, you are hereby notified that you have the right to apply for review of the State Prison sentence imposed on you on today.


The application must be filed within 30 days after the date of the sentence, but not thereafter except for good cause shown.

If you file such an application, your sentence will be reviewed by a Board of three members, who will be either Judicial Referees and/or Superior Court Judges.

**Review of the sentence may result in a decrease or increase of the minimum or maximum term within the limits fixed by law, or there may be no change in the sentence.**

**Note:** Only state prison sentences, whether stand committed, suspended or deferred, are subject to sentence review. Sentence review is not available for those sentences mandated by statute.

**APPLICATION FOR SENTENCE REVIEW**

I hereby apply for review of the sentence imposed on me on December 11, 2025


I have read the above notice and understand it.

## **HOW TO ORDER A TRANSCRIPT**

The New Hampshire Supreme Court has approved eScribers, a company located in Phoenix, Arizona, as the transcriber of all transcripts for all New Hampshire courts. A copy of the order designating eScribers as the transcriber and approving the rates that it may charge for preparing transcripts can be found [here](#).

**(NOTE: If your case is an appeal to the Supreme Court you will receive an order from the Supreme Court explaining how to request a transcript.)**

1. YOU MAY BUY AN OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT OF YOUR CASE. The transcript will be made from the recording taken during your hearing. All transcripts must be prepared by eScribers, the court approved transcriber.

You may request a portion of the hearing to be transcribed, however, the entire testimony of one witness must be transcribed, not simply selected responses to a few questions.

2. To order a transcript, go to <https://escribers.net> or contact eScribers at (800) 257-0885. The website or phone contact will provide instructions on how to order the transcript. You will be required to pay the estimated cost of the transcript before the record will be requested from the court. Instructions for determining the estimated cost of the transcript will be provided by the website or phone contact. If the calculated estimate is too low, you may be required to pay an additional deposit and this may delay your request. It is also possible that the actual cost of the transcript will be lower than your deposit in which case you will receive a refund of the overpayment.

3. Unless other arrangements have been made, when your transcript is completed, you will receive one digitally signed copy of the transcript in PDF-A format by email. You can print out the transcript on paper but you cannot change any of the information. The official version of the transcript will be sent to the court. Your copy is a certified version of the official transcript.

4. YOU MAY BUY A COPY OF A TRANSCRIPT THAT HAS ALREADY BEEN PREPARED. You may make your request directly to eScribers at (800) 257-0885 or [sales@escribers.net](mailto:sales@escribers.net) or to the court where the hearing was held.

5. When ordering a transcript please be prepared to provide the correct name of the case, docket number, name of the court where the hearing took place, and date(s) of hearing.
