
ORDER ON MULTIPLE CAMERAS IN COURTROOM

Court TV, a digital broadcast medium, has requested to "live stream" the trial in the above case. The request is granted under Rule 204. Court TV has also requested that it be allowed to post a second camera¹ in the courtroom that it intends to train the second camera on the defendant during the proceedings. The court has discretion whether to allow multiple cameras. In this case, a second camera will be allowed, but its position in the courtroom will be limited to avoid disruption to the proceedings and to eliminate the risk of inadvertently capturing confidential communications among the attorneys and Mr. Verrill. The second camera may be placed in the public seating area next to the primary camera. It may be trained on Mr. Verrill, but in no event shall any confidential communications be captured or broadcast. The court retains the discretion to alter or amend this order as circumstances may require.

¹ The primary camera will be stationed in the public seating area and positioned to capture the witness. At no time shall the camera be directed to capture the images of the jurors, either while they are seated or while they are entering and exiting the courtroom.
