RECOMMENDATION TO ACCEPT RESIGNATION REQUEST

On November 18, 2014, the Professional Conduct Committee deliberated Peter D. Prevett's request to resign pursuant to Rule 37(11). Members present included David M. Rothstein, Chair, Benette Pizzimenti, Vice Chair, Susan R. Chollet, Alan J. Cronheim, Richard H. Darling, Heather E. Krans, Georges J. Roy, David W. Ruoff, and Martha Van Oot.

Mr. Prevett was admitted to the New Hampshire Bar on April 15, 2008 and practiced law until July of 2014. He is 82 years old. He does not intend to continue practicing law.

Mr. Prevett executed an affidavit on October 13, 2014, acknowledging that there was clear and convincing evidence that he violated the following Rules of Professional Conduct:

Rules 1.1.(b)(4)-(b)(5) and (c)(2)-(4): Competence
Rules 1.4(a)(2) and (b): Communications
Rule 3.1: Meritorious Claims and Contentions
Rule 8.4(a): Violating the Rules of Professional Conduct


Mr. Prevett violated the Rules of Professional Conduct in connection with his role as attorney for Abigail's Bakery.

Assistant Disciplinary Counsel recommends that Mr. Prevett be allowed to resign from the Bar.

Mr. Prevett also agreed to pay costs in the investigation and pursuit of this disciplinary matter.

Upon consideration, the Committee voted to recommend to the Supreme Court that Mr. Prevett be allowed to resign from the Bar.
