ORDER ISSUING PUBLIC CENSURE

This is a reciprocal discipline matter. Sup. Ct. R. 37(12). Jamie Mauritz James, Esquire, was issued a public reprimand by the Massachusetts Board of Bar Overseers (“BBO”) on December 9, 2019. The New Hampshire Attorney Discipline Office (“ADO”) filed a certified copy of the public reprimand on January 13, 2020. On August 4, 2020, the New Hampshire Supreme Court issued an order finding appropriate, under Rule 37(12)(d), the imposition of reciprocal discipline in this state. The Court remanded the matter to this Committee for the issuance of that discipline, which is a public censure.

Accordingly, the Professional Conduct Committee issues a public censure to Jamie Mauritz James, Esquire, as reciprocal discipline based on the BBO’s order of December 9, 2019. In accord with the Court’s order, the public censure is issued subject to the same conditions Attorney Mauritz must complete in conjunction with the BBO’s public reprimand. The ADO is charged

with the responsibility to ensure that those conditions are completed.
